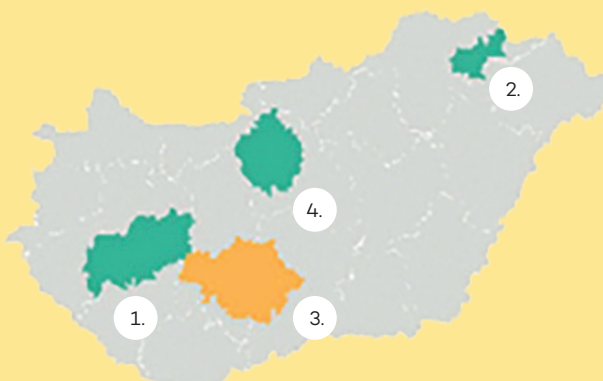
INTRODUCING

THE CENTRAL DANUBE DEVELOPMENT AGENCY NONPROFIT LTD. (CDDA)

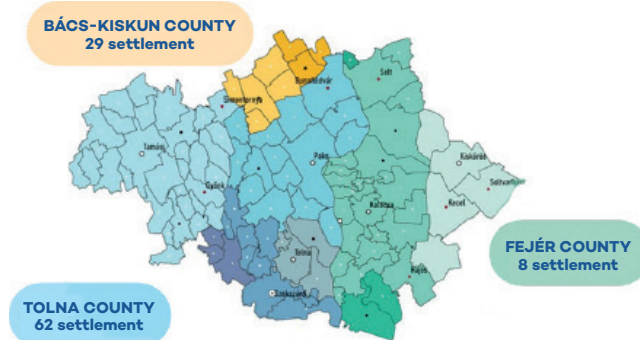
- A 100% state-owned non-profit organisation established in 2020.

- Implementer of the Development Concept (2021–2035) and the Strategic and Operational Programme (2021–2027) of the Priority Area.
- Regional coordinator of the development of 99 municipalities in 3 counties.
- Umbrella organisation for regional cooperation.
- Leader of expert working groups.
- Developer and updater of regional databases.
- Generator and implementer of national and international projects.
- Responsible for regional communication and good practice sharing.
